Overview

Neonatal medicine has gone through a remarkable development through research. But, it may be difficult to translate this wealth of knowledge into clinical guidelines. The International Conference on Evidence Based Neonatology (EBNEO) has a vision, that care of newborn infants is based on best available evidence. The purpose of this conference is to disseminate evidence based neonatal medicine and to create a platform for communication between leading experts and professionals in the field of Neonatology.

This conference is the third bi-annual international meeting of the Society of EBNEO. The founding conference took place in Stockholm in 2011. This year, the conference is hosted by The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and is chaired by Dr. Haresh Kirpalani. Co-chairs of this meeting and the Society are Drs. Mikael Norman and Stefan Johansson (Karolinska Institutet of Stockholm, Sweden).

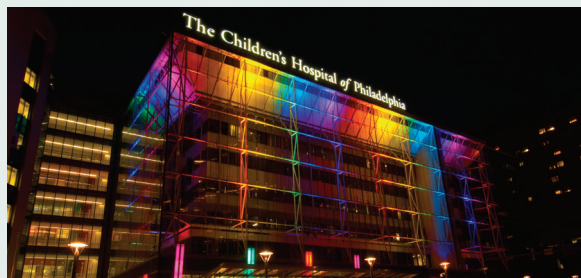
